

in the coming weeks. It was agreed that we not formally adopt them but use them as guidelines only.

A. Parks called Jack Lauder to discuss some of the unsatisfactory Cemetery stone repairs. Mr. Lauder, a farmer, said that he was not happy with some of the repairs but hadn't had the time to meet with Bonnie Waters about them. Ann will contact him in a week or two to get an update on their progress.

A. Parks spoke to the new minister of the South Perinton Methodist Church regarding the mounting block, which had not been facing in the correct direction since the remodeling of the church a few years ago. The pastor is in favor of the Commission locating someone to fix the block and to let her know so she can contact him. J. Keplinger said she would ask Scott Copp for some names.

J. Keplinger mentioned that Floris Lent, a resident of Wilkinson Road, across from the South Perinton Cemetery, had some concerns regarding the stones and the mounting block. She had done some investigating, and came up with a detailed list of each grave stone and the information pertinent to it.

The historic markers will soon be installed in the Egypt Historic District, one by Hogan Road and the other between Aldrich Road and the traffic light on Loud Road. This is a new traffic light at the corner of Loud Road and Pittsford-Palmyra Road.

J. Keplinger also mentioned that the Village has appointed a five member Historic Commission.

J. Keplinger is working with the state DOT about placing an historic marker in front of the Ranney house on Pittsford-Palmyra Road, the oldest home in Perinton.

Barb Clay mentioned a few possible dates for the historic plaques breakfast. It will be catered, and take place in Room 208 B in the Community Center. The hours will be 7:30 AM until 9:00 AM. It will be a buffet style breakfast, and hopefully a nice opportunity for the designated landmark homeowners to mingle and receive their plaque.
